November 10: Rome, Italy. Whether enjoying the street performers at the Spanish Steps, people-watching over a fine glass of wine in colorful Trastevere, or taking in the historical and architectural glory that is Rome, visitors have so much to choose from in this truly Eternal City. St. Peter's Basilica is a full-day outing, featuring the Sistine Chapel and panoramic city vistas for those willing to climb to the top of the dome.

November 11: Florence/Pisa, Italy. From the 13th to 16th centuries, an era of creative freedom encouraged the genius of Dante, Donatello, Michelangelo, Giotto, Botticelli, da Vinci, and Machiavelli to create some of the world's most noted masterpieces. Must-sees are the Galleria dell'Accademia, with its iconic masterpiece, Michelangelo's *David*. The Uffizi is home to the most renowned art gallery in Italy, with representative works by the titans of Renaissance art. Join an excursion to Pisa, and tour the city's beautiful and historic Campo dei Miracoli.

November 12: Ajaccio, Corsica. Ajaccio is the birthplace of Napoleon Bonaparte, and the Napoleonic legacy dominates the city in its statues and street names. Ajaccio offers guests a pleasing number of sites to explore — the Musee Fesch, with its fine collection of Renaissance paintings, and Napoleon's birthplace, the Casa Bonaparte. Join a tasting excursion and sample the fragrant oils, wines, liqueurs, nuts, and chocolates that are distinct to Corsica.

November 13: Genoa, Italy. Discover the history and beautiful architecture of this ancient seaport in the lovely pink stone Palazzo Tursi where letters of

Christopher Columbus and Paganini's famed Guarneri violin are on display. Explore the gemlike villages of the Cinque Terre, and Portofino, the picturesque and elegant resort.

November 14 and 15: Monte Carlo, Monaco. Monte Carlo is an enchanting place, known as the international capital of luxury and for its celebrity-sightings, casinos and nightlife. Yet the old world shines through in its art and architecture. Palaces, cathedrals and museums dot this small municipality in an old town full of rich history. Catch the changing of the guard, then tour the public areas at the Palais du Prince. Regent offers a variety of excursions to delightful Riviera towns, among them:



G r a s s e (the self-proclaimed perfume capital of the world), scenic St. Paul de Vence with

its wonderful boutiques and galleries, charming medieval Eze, or Nice with its incomparable museums.

November 16: Marseille, France. Marseille is a far cry from the sleepy villages it once inspired in Cézanne's paintings. With more than a million people, the city is the cosmopolitan and exuberant capital of southern Europe. Explore its picturesque Old Quarter, lively sidewalk cafes and shops, and Romanesque-Byzantine Notre Dame de la Garde Basilica. Among the excellent excursions, choose to visit Aix-En-Provence, Avignon & Les Baux, or Castellet.

November 17: Palma de Mallorca, Spain. Mallorca is an island of contrasts. To the south is a busy tourist area with hotels, bars, restaurants, shopping and dazzling night life. To the north are rocky valleys, sleepy villages shrouded in bougainvillea, and breathtaking views. Palma is dominated by the breathtaking Gothic Cathedral, located high above the waterfront on the site of a former mosque.

November 18: Valencia, Spain. Valencia was established by the Greeks and later occupied by the Carthaginians, Romans, Visigoths and Arabs. A 15th century artistic movement here gave the world spectacular paintings, sculptures, and jewels. Today a "City of Arts and Sciences," Valencia offers visitors remarkable samples of modern architecture, alongside such notable classics as the 13th century Cathedral and Chapel of the Holy Chalice. The Chapel contains the chalice which legend says was used by Christ at the Last Supper.

November 19 and 20: Barcelona, Spain. One of Europe's most visually stunning cities, Barcelona balances the medieval intimacy of its Gothic Quarter with the grace and distinction of the wide boulevards in the Moderniste Eixample. It was the home of architect Antoni Gaudí, whose Sagrada Familia Cathedral, Park Güell and Casa Milà are the most profound statements of Modernisme. View the splendid works at the Picasso Museum and the Miro Foundation.
